

## The College at a Glance

1. Government General Degree College, Narayangarh (hereafter referred to as GGDCN) is situated on the land donated by the villagers in response to the call given by the local revolutionary-turned-saint, Ushananda Giri Maharaj, for the establishment of an Academic Institution of Excellence. Ushananda Giri Maharaj (born Ajit Maity) was a banker during the colonial regime in India. He was also associated with a —Gupto Samitil (Secret Association of the Armed Revolutionaries). He secretly siphoned off all the money from the Bank for the hallowed cause of the armed struggle for India's Independence, and eventually absconded to the Himalayas. Maharaj later returned to the village in the form of a holy person and set up the —Yogayatan Ashram, which is currently affiliated to the —Jhargarm Sebayatan. During his lifetime, he established three Higher Secondary Schools in the locality. He went incognito, again, from Bhagalpur, Bihar, when a rumour spread that he was none other than Netaji Subhash Chandra Bose. During his anonymous stay there, he wrote a letter to the Managing Committee of —Yogayatan Ashram, expressing his final wish to use the land adjoining —Domnaar Paar (exactly where the present college is situated) for the establishment of a college. Later, paying heed to the demand of the local people of this region, the Hon. Chief Minister of West Bengal, Smt. Mamata Banerjee took the necessary initiative to establish this College as her Dream Project.

2. GGDCN is recognised by the University Grant Commission under section 2(f) of the UGC Act, dated 11<sup>th</sup> May 2023. The College was accredited and graded B (CGPA - 2.49) by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) in January 2024.
  3. The college campus is located at Vill. - Rathipur, P.O. - Bhadrakali, Dist. - Paschim Medinipur, Block - Narayangarh. It is approximately 7 kilometres from Narayangarh Railway Station and about 28 kilometres from Kharagpur Railway Junction. Strategically situated near the Kolkata-Chennai Highway (NH-16), the campus is around 200 kilometres away from Kolkata, ensuring good connectivity.
  4. The institute covers an area of approximately 10.27 acres. The campus features an Academic Block, well-equipped laboratories, a seminar hall, an administrative block, and a large playground. The college has a modern badminton court and cricket practice setup for students, along with amenities for other sports.
  5. The college meets the educational requirements of socially and economically underprivileged students of the surrounding locality. By providing college education to the doorsteps of these students, GGDCN has made higher education accessible and affordable for those who would otherwise have been unfairly deprived.
  6. The College takes special interest in bringing female students and students from underprivileged sections of society into the mainstream of education by offering them the support of an active —mentor-mentee system. In addition to performing the conventional roles of an —Institution of Higher Learning, GGDCN

7. has been trying its best to provide an encouraging environment, a safe space, and proper guidance to its female students to foster gender equity in the immediate locality and society.
8. The College library, air conditioned with munificent facilities and cosy reading rooms, encourages students to spend more time with books than they would otherwise do in the sultry and stifling heat of the place. The library is equipped with the necessary books, a wide range of professional books, journals, magazines, periodicals, and research publications, and the total acquisition of these books is constantly enhancing and expanding.
9. The classrooms are generously spacious, well ventilated, and equipped with all necessary teaching-learning tools for offering a suitable learning environment to students.
10. The science laboratories are furnished with modern and sophisticated equipment to support academic and research needs effectively.
11. The college has a CCTV surveillance system to ensure the safety and security of all. Moreover, unauthorised access to the college premises is stringently checked to maintain peace and order.
12. The college offers free Wi-Fi to students to enhance their learning experience.
13. The students are encouraged to participate in holistic education comprising curricular and co-curricular activities like sports, debates, discussions, and individual and community development activities. The college has state-of-the-art Gymnasiums with separate spaces for both boys and girls. These Gymnasiums are equipped with all sorts of modern amenities.
14. The college has separate Common Rooms for both boys and girls.
15. The college has two Units of NSS, and its participants take part in different state and national-level activities.
16. The college has a functional canteen for students and staff.
17. We are determined and committed to equipping our pupils with all the indispensable skill-sets in the realms of subject knowledge, environmental ethics, morally-sustainable living skills, affective skills, communication skills, interpersonal skills, and leadership skills so that their life— even beyond the immediate boundaries of the college— becomes self-sufficient, respectable and worthy of emulation. - The **West Bengal Student Credit Card Scheme**, which alleviates students' financial constraints, is also available for students in need.

**Note:** *Any scholarship award is liable to be withdrawn in case of unsatisfactory work or misconduct.*

## Rules and regulations of the College

### 1. General Instructions to Students Regarding Conduct and Discipline

1. Students must enter and exit classrooms with the teacher's permission and maintain decorum during classes.
2. Noisy or disorderly conduct, including loitering in corridors and disturbing ongoing classes, is strictly prohibited.
3. Courteous behaviour towards faculty members, non-teaching staff, and fellow students is expected at all times.
4. Vandalism or disfiguring college property (walls, furniture, doors, windows, etc.) is a punishable offence.
5. Students must avoid any act detrimental to the reputation and interest of the college.
6. Use of mobile phones in classrooms or during academic sessions is strictly prohibited unless permitted for academic purposes.
7. Substance abuse, smoking, or consumption of intoxicants on the college premises is strictly prohibited.

### 2. Attendance Requirements

As per Vidyasagar University regulations:

Minimum attendance to be eligible for University Final Examination:

**Collegiate: 75% and above.**

**Non-Collegiate: 60% to 74%, with condonation fee.**

**Below 60%: Not eligible to fill up examination forms for the University Examination as per the Regulation of Vidyasagar University.**

Students failing to attend any class in a particular month may have their names struck off from the register. Students are allowed to appear at the final examination as —non-collegiate students|| on payment of the requisite condonation fee.

Students must have 60% attendance in class before every Unit Test. Students failing to attend the requisite 60% of classes will NOT be allowed to appear in the Unit Test.

**A student who does not attend a single class in a particular month will not be allowed to attend further classes, and his/her name may be struck off from the register.**

[ Note: *Non-Collegiate Students, Parents and outsiders are allowed to enter campus by special permission from the college authority with specific reasons.* ]

### 3. Identity Card and Campus Access

- Students must carry their college-issued Identity Cards every day.
- Entry to the college premises without a valid ID card is not permitted.
- Students must show the card when asked by any teaching or non-teaching staff or at the main gate.

### 4. Anti-Ragging Policy

- The college follows UGC regulations and the Supreme Court directives on Zero Tolerance towards Ragging.
- Ragging in any form—verbal, physical, or psychological—is a criminal offence.
- Students involved in ragging shall face disciplinary action, including expulsion and legal proceedings.
- Every student must submit an anti-ragging undertaking at the time of admission, as per UGC norms.

### 5. Academic Calendar

- First Term: 1st July – Beginning of Puja Holidays
- Second Term: Post-Puja Reopening – Winter Recess
- Third Term: 1st January – Summer Recess



### 6. Additional Disciplinary Guidelines (As per UGC & VU)

- Sexual harassment, caste-based discrimination, or any form of harassment will be dealt with under strict disciplinary and legal measures.
- Students must respect diversity and uphold constitutional values, including gender sensitivity, secularism, and social responsibility.
- Participation in academic, co-curricular, and extension activities is encouraged as per CBCS/NEP guidelines.
- Use of unfair means in exams, including impersonation, is strictly prohibited and will invite severe action.

- I. Admission in the **1st semester** of 4-year / 3-year undergraduate (UG) **Hons./ Degree programmes (under CCFUP as per NEP 2020)** for the academic session **2026-27** will be through the Centralised Admission portal:

- II. Candidates who have passed 10+2/ Equivalent level examination from any recognized Council/ Board/ University in the year 2022/ 2023/ 2024/ 2025/2026 can apply for admission in UG SEMESTER- I.
- III. Reservation rules are as per G.O. and extant rules of the Government of West Bengal.

## 2. GENERAL DIRECTIONS TO THE APPLICANTS FOR ONLINE APPLICATION AND ADMISSION

- I. Applicants are advised to make the choice of the subjects wisely during the application procedure.
- II. Applicants are advised to avoid any typographical errors. Any wrong information furnished in the application as a result of a typing error may lead to the cancellation of the application.
- III. Applicants must upload a passport-size image, a scanned image of their signature and a scanned image of their H.S. Mark sheet at the time of submission of the online application and applicants belonging to reserved categories (EWS, SC, ST, OBC-A, OBC-B, PWD, etc.) must upload the scanned image of their Caste/Disability Certificates/EWS Certificates.
- IV. Applications not accompanied by proper supporting documents will also be cancelled

V. Documents required at the time of verification:

- a) Print out of the Application Form. The candidates will have to put signatures on the specified space on the forms.
- b) Copy of Online Admission Fee payment receipt.

- III. **Bachelor's degree:** On successful completion of three years, the relevant Bachelor's degree shall be awarded. A Bachelor's degree requires six semesters with 126 credits
- IV. **Bachelor's degree (Honours):** On the successful completion of the fourth year, a student shall be awarded a degree Honours. A Bachelor's degree Honours requires an eight semester with total of 166 credits.

## Different Disciplines / Subjects to study under CCFUP:

- I. **Major discipline (MJ):** Major discipline is the discipline or subject of main focus and the degree will be awarded in that discipline. Courses shall be of 4 credits.
- II. **Minor discipline (MI):** A minor discipline to be opted from the bunch/ group of subjects assigned for the Major subject. Courses shall be of 4 credits.

### ❖ SKILLS ENHANCEMENT COURSES (SEC):

Four (04) SEC courses shall be of 2 credits each distributed in first four semesters.

These courses are aimed at imparting practical skills, hands-on training, soft skills, etc., to enhance the employability of students. Three (03) SEC courses shall be of 3 credits each. Colleges shall arrange the skill training to the students in association with Sector Skill Councils (SSC)/ Paschim Banga Society for Skill Development (PBSSD) or any other recognized council/organizations. Separate list of courses under SEC may be provided in due course. Training, assignment evaluation etc. shall be conducted at the College level. College authority may designate course coordinator for SEC for each discipline who may guide students to complete the courses.

### ❖ VALUE-ADDED COURSES (VAC):

Two (02) introductory-level Value added courses are to enhance the standard of the students beyond specified academic curriculum. Courses shall be of 2 credits each.

### ❖ SUMMER INTERNSHIP / APPRENTICESHIP / COMMUNITY SERVICES:

Students will be provided with opportunities for Internship /Apprenticeship/Community Services with nearby locality, local bodies, local industry, business organizations, health and allied areas. It shall be a short - term

engagement of 8 weeks in a suitable organization or hands on training in order to gain work experience. There shall be two forms of summer training:

Community Services (4 Credits): In the 1st year of study, students shall be oriented to Community Services during summer term. Minimum 45-60 hours engagement in NSS, Rural Development, Social Development activities under the supervision of College Teacher.

Internship/ Apprenticeship (4 Credits): In the 2nd year of study, students shall be oriented to Internship/ Apprenticeship. Minimum 8 weeks engagement in local bodies, local industry, NGOs, business organizations, health and allied areas, rural entrepreneurs, local governments (such as panchayats, municipalities), survey, media organizations, artists, crafts persons etc. shall be under the supervision of the College. After completion of internship/ Apprenticeship students will have to produce a report related to the work carried out,

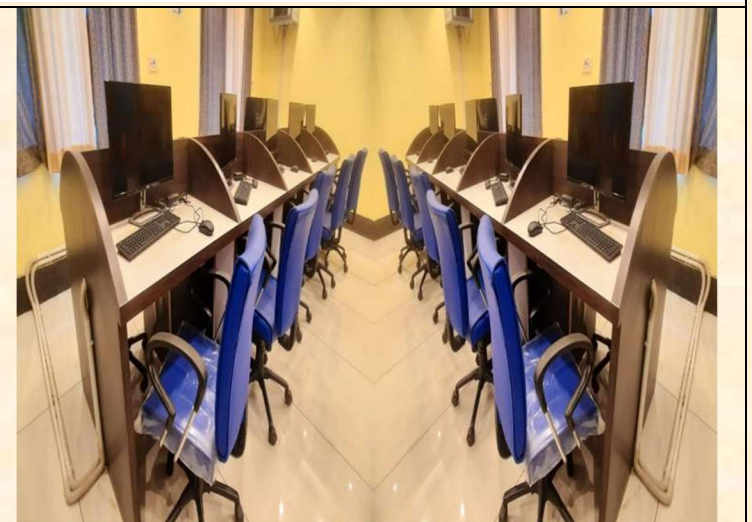
